Plastic Free Letchworth – Community Audit Tool

Introduction

In the past 100 years the world has produced a lot of plastic; much of this still exists somewhere today. Half of all plastic produced is for single-use purposes, including bottles, food packaging, coffee cups, straws, bags and plastic cutlery. These items, designed to be used for minutes, will still be on our planet in hundreds of years. Up to 12 million tonnes of plastic ends up in the sea each year and the impact of this was shockingly highlighted in the latest Blue Planet series. This plastic causes harm to ocean animals and can end up in seafood that is on our plates.

The Plastic Free Letchworth project helped people, businesses, schools and community groups reduce their plastic use. To assist project allies, this self-audit tool, was developed to enable them to identify existing good practice and provide ideas for actions that could further reduce their use of single use plastic.

Provide plastic free wipes in the baby change unit and remind			
visitors not to flush any wipes down the loo			
Buy toilet paper wrapped in paper, rather than plastic

Suggest that groups who use the space to host talks hold a meeting			
themed around plastic waste			
For outdoor events encourage visitors to bring their own			
bottles/cups/cutlery
